6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- Nineteen teachers are on the Board of Studies of both UG and PG Courses of the University of Mysore. The members are largely involved in the revision of syllabus to cater to the needs of the students for their career growth. Whenever there is a change in the syllabus, teachers of such departments sit together at the beginning of the semester and plan out how the changes have to be incorporated and dealt with in the class
- Each department finds different ways other than class room teaching alone to give a holistic approach to the subject
- The Curriculum is thus carried out in such a manner to complete the syllabus well in time

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Highly qualified (47with Ph.D.) and dedicated faculty
- Students are encouraged to make presentations on topics of their choice within a specific limited time period during their class hours
- Students are taken on field visits, Hospitals, Industries, De-Addiction Centres, Prisons, Police Academies, Rehabilitation Centres, Slums, Tribal visits, etc., to have first hand information in their respective subjects
- Group discussions were conducted in classes for exchange of creative thoughts among the students; to develop communication skills, to overcome stage fear, to develop management and leadership skills. Students of certain departments having ICT facilities were asked to prepare PPTs on a selected topic and present them in their class rooms

- Continuous evaluation is through different methods like internal assessment test, assignments, group discussion, seminars etc.
- Transparency is maintained in the evaluation process. Blue books are assessed and returned to the students. If there are any grievances students are encouraged to meet the individual teacher and the Head of the Department and the issue is resolved. If any discrepancy in IA marks is found by the student, once it is uploaded on the University Web site, such cases are addressed through the examination section of the College.

- All such departments where the teaching faculty have registered for PhD and are expected to complete the course work, which is held on Saturdays, are allotted classes in such a manner that they are free on Saturdays
