

Regulations Governing the Semester System to Graduate Courses 2015-2016

Courses Offered and Duration of the Course:

- (a) Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) (6 Semesters/3 Years)
- (b) Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.) (6 Semesters/3 Years)
- (c) Bachelor of Business Management (B.B.M.) (6 Semesters/3 Years)

Post-graduate Courses

- (1) M.Sc. in Criminology & Forensic Science (4 Semesters/2 Years)
- (2) M.Phil. in Criminology & Forensic Science (2 Semesters/1 Year)

Eligibility for Admission to the Degree Courses:

B.A /B.Com. /B.B.M: A candidate who has passed the Two-Year Pre-University Examination conducted by the Pre-University Board of Education in the State of Karnataka or any other examination considered as equivalent thereto by the University is eligible for admission to the First Semester of the Course.

- a. Students who have passed any JOC (10+2) are eligible to join the First Semester B.A.
- b. Students who have passed the following JOC (10+2) courses are eligible to join First Semester Degree Course as detailed below:

(i) A candidate who has passed 3 years Diploma in Commercial or Secretarial Practice conducted by the Department of Technical Education, Government of Karnataka is eligible for admission to Third Semester B.Com/B.B.M. directly. However, such a candidate has to pass the languages and other Compulsory Papers viz., Constitution of India and Environmental Studies of first two semesters. Such candidates will not be subjected to any IA in these papers. However, for eventual calculation of 80 marks is equated to 100 marks.

(ii) A candidate who has passed 3 years Diploma in Business Administration conducted by the Department of Technical Education, Government of Karnataka is eligible for admission to Fifth Semester B.B.M./B.Com. Degree Course, subject to the condition that, the candidate has to pass papers in languages as compulsory papers of first Four Semesters B.B.M./B.Com. Such candidates will not be subjected to any IA in these papers. However, for eventual calculation of 80 marks is equated to 100 marks.

Curriculum (Scheme):

a. For all the Courses (except B.Com. & B.B.M)

(i) In the First Semester there shall be 6 papers viz., 2 languages, Constitution of India and 3 Optional Subjects.

(ii) In the Second Semester there shall be 6 papers viz., 2 languages, Environmental Studies and 3 optional Subjects.

(iii) In the Third Semester there shall be 5 papers viz., 2 languages and 3 Optional Subjects.

(iv) In the Fourth Semester there shall be 6 papers viz., 2 languages, Computer Applications and 3 optional subjects.

(v) In the Fifth & Sixth Semesters there shall be 3 Optional, each optional having 3 papers.

b. For B.Com. / B.B.M. Course in sixth semester, there shall be 6 papers in each semester. In the first 4 semesters there shall be 2 Language papers and 3 Core/Allied papers each, and one compulsory paper (Constitution of India in the First Semester, Environmental Studies in the second Semester and Computer Application in Third and Fourth Semesters) respectively. B.Com. students shall study Computer Fundamentals in the Third Semester and Computer Applications in the fourth Semester. B.B.M students have Computer Applications in the third semester.

Medium of Instruction:

The medium of instruction for B.A. shall be English or Kannada depending on the medium chosen by the student. A candidate may write the examination of the entire paper either in English or in Kannada. This does not apply to Language examinations. B.B.M. and B.Com courses are taught only in English medium.

Subjects of Study:

1. B.A. Degree candidates shall select 3 optional subjects approved by the Board of Studies as per the Regulations.
2. B.Com./B.B.M: The respective Board of Studies shall offer the Optional papers. The Optional papers available in B.B.M. course are:
 - i) Financial Management
 - ii) Marketing Management
 - iii) Human Resources Management
3. Students of all Degree Courses shall study the compulsory subjects: Constitution of India in the First Semester, Environmental Studies in the Second Semester and Computer Application in the Third/Fourth Semesters respectively.

Group I - Languages:

A student shall study any two of the following languages: English, Kannada, Hindi, Sanskrit, Urdu, Telugu, Tamil, Malayalam, Persian, Arabic, French, German and Russian.

1. Out of the two languages selected, one of the languages shall be an Indian language. However, in the case of foreign nationals, the requirement of an Indian language may be waived by the University.
2. Indian Language means any one of the languages mentioned in the VIII Schedule of the Constitution.
3. The University may permit private study of a language by a student, if there is no provision for instruction in that language in a college and allow him/her to appear for the examination in the subject without insisting on attendance. Such candidates will not be subjected to any IA marks. However, for eventual calculation of 80 marks is equated to 100 marks.
4. Deaf and Dumb, Spastic, Mentally challenged and students with Learning disability shall offer any one language.

Note: For B.A. Applicants:

1. Those students who opt for Optional English, Archaeology & Museology should study only in English Medium.
2. Candidates applying for the above combinations are should indicate their preference in the application forms under 2 groups. In case the candidate is not selected for any one of the groups indicated, he/she will have to accept the available combination and the medium.
3. If the number of students in any combination is less than 15, such combinations will not be offered.

4. All Students have to compulsorily open a Bank Account in the State Bank of Mysore-Campus Branch.
